



HIMALAYAN BLUE SHEEP

Hunting blue sheep in Pakistan commenced in 2004. Permits are limited and are auctioned by the Wildlife Department in the Northern Area just prior to commencement of the hunting season.

These hunts are a real adventure and include a long trek into the hunting area with porters-similar to the way the hunts in Nepal are conducted. Since the permits are auctioned, it is difficult to say what the exact price will be. Ibex can be added on a trophy fee basis.

In western China, south of Kashi, this blue sheep is known as Himalayan Blue Sheep. Please refer to our "Blue Sheep Mania" brochure, which describes the various blue sheep found in China, prices and all other details.

Enjoy the magnificent Northern Area of Pakistan, where superb trophies are taken, and safety is guaranteed.

Even though you will be in awe of the 200 mountains over 20,000 feet, you will typically hunt at 12,000 to 14,500 feet. There are excellent ibex over 40 inches with the largest taken last season of 47 inches.

SEASON: October 1 thru April 20

BEST TIME: From December 20 through mid-January. However, good ibex are found from about mid-November through the end of March.

ITINERARY: 12-day schedule from arrival in Islamabad with 8 full hunting days

ARRIVAL CITY: Islamabad

LODGING: Typically, you will fly camp and stay in mountain huts, heated tents, or stay in village homes.

FOOD: Tasty, but basic

ELEVATION: 12,000 - 14,500 feet

TERRAIN: From gentle mountains to difficult terrain. The ability of the hunter will be matched to the terrain.



CLIMATE: Generally, the temperatures are moderate with daytime highs of 20-40 degrees F.

INCLUDED: Meet and greet in Islamabad, 8-day hunt with full crew, accommodations in local hotels, mountain huts, heated tents or village homes.

NOT INCLUDED: Firearm permit, vehicle transfer from Islamabad to hunting area or commercial airline service Islamabad to Gilget, hotels in Islamabad before or after the hunt, visa, gratuities, excess baggage and items of a personal nature. While staying in Gilget, we use the Gilget Serena, a fine hotel. If traveling on the Karakoram Highway from Islamabad, (an amazing trip), we usually stay at the Motel Besham, which is half-way to Gilget.

ADD'L. TROPHIES: Feral yaks may also be available on a trophy -fee basis.
