Breaking Records... it's what we do!



If Western Roan or Western Buffalo are on your list of desired trophies then Benin deserves serious consideration. This largely unpublicized country in western Africa has an enviable record for quality trophies. The outfitter has years of experience in organizing safaris in the Porga Zone on the edge of Pendjari National Park and consistently produces quality trophies.

While the Western Buffalo may be smaller in both body size and horn configuration than his southern cousin, he is every bit as challenging to hunt. Large bulls can approach 900 pounds and their temperament will never win a congeniality contest. They remain one of the most underrated trophies on the continent.



Hunting is conducted early in the year with the season beginning in January and continuing through April. Northern hemisphere clients think "winter" but in this near equatorial hunting area temperatures can reach well above 100 degrees during mid-day so a comfortable cool camp is a welcome sight at the end of a long session "on the track." To assure comfort, the outfitter provides generator powered air conditioning in the camps. Accommodations are bungalows with in-suite shower and toilet facilities and all the other amenities you have come to expect on an African Safari. Transportation to and from the hunting area is provided by hunting car so costly air charters are not needed but can be arranged at the client's request. For the hunter venturing to Africa for the first safari, the price includes the loan of a scope sighted .375 H&H if desired.



Safaris are offered for both 13-days and 20-days and on the longer safari it is possible to hunt 2x1. In addition to roan and buffalo, Benin also offers the opportunity to hunt lions. They are hunted in the traditional method of tracking, since baiting is not allowed. The hunter interested in lion should book for 13 days and concentrate on lion until successful, and then he can turn his attention to other trophies. Typically, lions in the north don't carry the thick manes found in eastern and southern countries but that does not diminish the challenge of the hunt and good lions are taken every year.

Besides roan, buffalo and lion, several species of antelope may be hunted.
