PRICE:

The price is \$33,500 all-inclusive from arrival in Yakutsk (based on 4 hunters traveling together) or \$40,500 (based on 2 hunters). Hotels/meals before/after hunt, tips and shipment of trophy are not included.. The price also includes one round-trip helicopter transfer from Yakutsk to the hunting region and return.

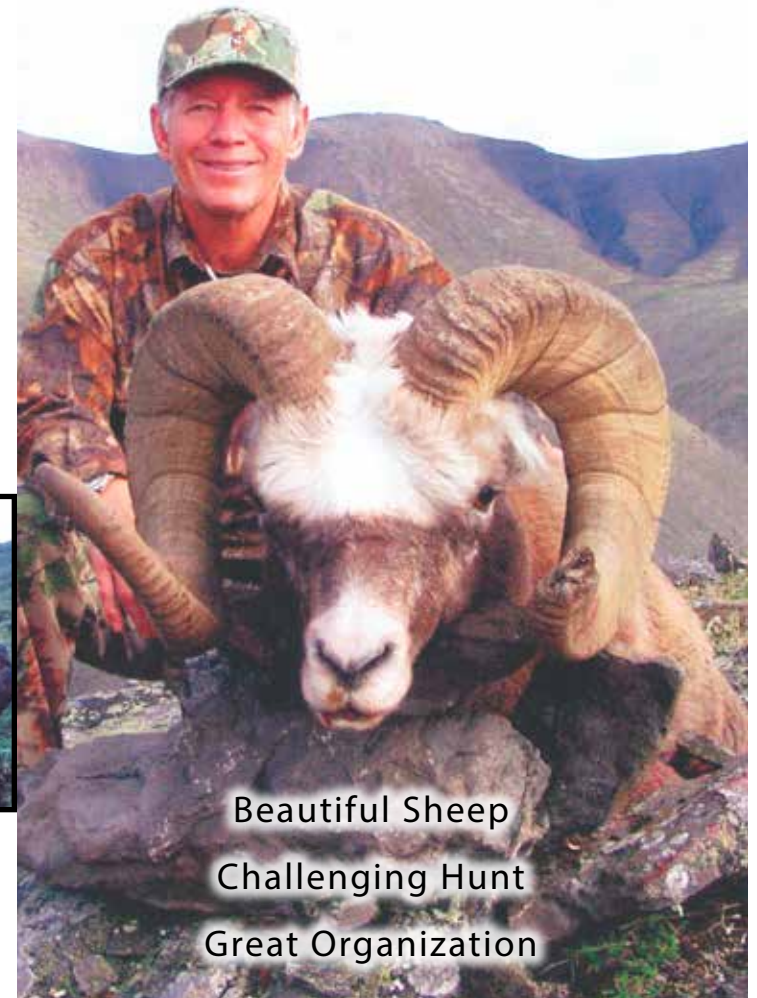
Non-hunter rates are \$4,000. If available you can add Siberian Brown Bear for \$6000.

The altitude in Yakutia is only about 6,000 feet and the terrain can be difficult. The sheep are generally found in good numbers, which over the past 25 years has produced nearly 100% success. Hunting is done on foot, with each hunter having one or two guides.

CAMP ACCOMMODATIONS:

Accommodations are in tented camps.

We often utilize spike camps and supply the camps with the necessary equipment. Typically, you will spike out for 2-3 days, then return to base camp.

SEASON:

The season is from August 1 through October 15. We prefer to hunt during the month of August as the weather can become a major factor in the mountains beyond early September. The probability of connecting with a Siberian brown bear is rather slim, but if you feel lucky and wish to try, we must obtain a CITES brown bear export permit in advance of your hunt. You will need to pre-pay a CITES bear export permit of \$300, which is non-refundable.

WEATHER:

Weather in August will be above freezing in the daytime. Temperatures may be 45 - 55 degrees. Nights are cold dipping to below freezing, so a good sleeping bag is a must.
